JAMP Scholar to Council Member: An Alumna Success Story

I'm Dr. Summer Davies, a pediatric hospitalist and a proud former JAMP Scholar. I was part of the inaugural JAMP class and am now an associate professor, double board-certified in general pediatrics and pediatric hospital medicine. I graduated from Texas Tech University School of Medicine, completed my residency in North Carolina, and have been working in Lubbock, TX, for Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center since 2013. Today, I serve as the medical director for the pediatric floor at our hospital, the medical director for LISD, the director of our simulation lab, and the associate program director for our Pediatric Hospital Medicine Fellowship Program. This is truly my dream career, a dream I've held since I was 12 years old—and none of it would have been possible without JAMP.

Like many current JAMP Scholars, my journey to medical school was not easy. I grew up in a small town in a single-parent household, where my mother often worked two or three jobs just to put food on the table. There were times when we lacked basic necessities, such as running water or electricity, and we faced food insecurity. Despite these challenges, I was determined to pursue my dream of becoming a doctor. I was a first-generation college student with no financial resources, no backup plan, and little confidence that I could succeed.

That all changed when I discovered JAMP during my freshman year of college. The program gave me the financial resources to prepare for medical school and the mentorship, connections, and emotional support I needed to succeed. For the first time, I had access to elite medical schools, admissions staff, and peers who shared my journey. The summer internships, hands-on clinical experiences, and comprehensive MCAT preparation made all the difference. JAMP didn't just support me financially; it gave me the confidence and tools to achieve what once felt impossible. I genuinely believe I would not be a physician today without JAMP.

Today, I am honored to serve as a JAMP Council alternate for Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Medicine, mentoring the next generation of JAMP Scholars. I see firsthand how the program continues to evolve to meet the needs of its students, using evidence-based practices and feedback to drive meaningful change. JAMP is breaking cycles of poverty, addressing critical physician shortages in underserved areas, and shaping the future of medicine in Texas.

The 89th Texas Legislature needs to continue funding this impactful program. JAMP has proven its value time and time again, transforming the lives of students like me and ensuring Texas communities have access to quality healthcare. Without JAMP, I wouldn't be where I am today. This program is not just an investment in students—it's an investment in the health and future of Texas.

Expanding Access to Healthcare Education: An Overview of the JAMP Program

The Joint Admission Medical Program (JAMP) exists to address the critical need for more healthcare professionals in Texas, particularly in underserved and rural communities. Since its inception, JAMP has transformed the educational journeys of economically disadvantaged students by providing resources, mentorship, and a clear pathway to medical school.

One of the program's greatest strengths lies in its ability to build and nurture meaningful relationships. By uniting 68 undergraduate institutions, 14 medical schools, and all Texas university systems, the program supports 150 new students each year, aiming to transform healthcare in communities across the state. A remarkable additional benefit of JAMP is its statewide enhancement of pre-health advising and academic curricula at universities. This unique collaboration equips Texas to respond more effectively to emerging healthcare challenges and community needs. Truly, there is no other program like it in the nation.

Central to our mission is a steadfast focus on student success, guided by key performance indicators and a rigorous program evaluation process that drives continuous improvement. By consistently assessing outcomes, we deepen our understanding of our student population and refine our strategies to better support our scholars while addressing the evolving needs of Texas communities.

JAMP Leadership: Council, Faculty Directors and Medical School Coordinators

The success of the Joint Admission Medical Program (JAMP) is driven by the collaborative efforts of JAMP Leadership, including the JAMP Council, Executive Committee, JAMP Faculty Directors (JFDs), and Medical School Coordinators (MSCs). Together, they ensure JAMP Scholars receive the guidance, resources, and support needed to succeed on their journey to medical school.

The JAMP Council and Executive Committee: Leading the Way

The JAMP Council, comprising representatives from Texas medical schools, provides strategic oversight and ensures alignment with JAMP's mission. Their leadership fosters collaboration across institutions, enhancing JAMP's impact statewide. The Executive Committee, a subset of the Council, addresses program needs, evaluates outcomes, and makes key decisions to advance scholar success through delegation.

Guiding Scholars: The Role of JAMP Faculty Directors

JAMP Faculty Directors (JFDs) at each of the 68 partner undergraduate institutions are instrumental in identifying and mentoring scholars. They provide academic planning, MCAT preparation, and guidance throughout the medical school application process. JFDs ensure scholars meet rigorous program requirements and lay a solid foundation for success, offering tailored support at every step.

Empowering Scholars: The Impact of Medical School Coordinators

Medical School Coordinators (MSCs) at the 14 participating medical schools oversee summer internships, ensuring scholars gain meaningful academic and clinical experiences. MSCs provide mentorship during the transition from undergraduate to medical education, helping JAMP Scholars navigate challenges and achieve their professional goals.

United for Success: A Collaborative Support Network

JAMP's success is a testament to the collective efforts of its leadership, including the JAMP Council, Executive Committee, JAMP Faculty Directors (JFDs), and Medical School Coordinators (MSCs). The JAMP Council provides strategic oversight, fostering statewide collaboration and ensuring alignment with JAMP's mission. JFDs guide scholars through premedical preparation, offering tailored support in academic planning, MCAT readiness, and the medical school application process. MSCs oversee summer internships and mentorship, facilitating the transition into medical education and empowering scholars to achieve their goals. Together, this leadership network creates a seamless, holistic support system that enables economically disadvantaged students to thrive, increases access and representation in Texas medical schools, and drives JAMP's long-term impact.

JAMP Outreach and Recruitment: Statewide Initiatives

Over the last two years, JAMP implemented a five-tier outreach strategy, resulting in the largest year-over-year increase in new applications in program's history.

Digital Engagement: Enhancing Connections with Scholars

- **Social Media:** Launched strategic digital outreach to better connect with prospective students and stakeholders.
- **Newsroom Articles:** Featured scholar achievements, including awards, publications, and success stories, across digital platforms to highlight program advancements and JAMP's statewide impact.
- **JAMP Promotional Video:** Showcased the program's mission, impact, and success stories through a compelling narrative designed to inspire prospective scholars and engage stakeholders.

Empowered Applicants: Tailored Application Support and Resources

JAMP introduced a new Customer Relationship Management (CRM) protocol and launched a targeted campaign to help applicants navigate the process with confidence.

- **Application Initiative:** Personalized newsletters and proactive phone outreach deliver tailored resources and guidance to support students in completing their applications.
- **Communication Plan:** Engaging newsletters and email reminders keep students informed of essential document deadlines, ensuring timely submissions.

Early Recruitment Efforts: Inspiring Future Physicians

- **Undergraduate and High School Partnerships:** JAMP collaborates with organizations such as the Texas Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers (TACRAO), Health Occupations Students of America (HOSA) – Future Health Professionals, and the Texas Association of Advisors for the Health Professions (TAAHP). These partnerships promote JAMP opportunities through sessions at over 15 institutions, connecting directly with students and raising awareness of JAMP opportunities.
- **High School Presentations:** Tailored JAMP recruitment presentations encourage high school students to explore careers in medicine and serve Texas communities. This initiative includes over 20 high school sessions and the distribution of materials designed to inspire the next generation of healthcare professionals.
- **Pre-JAMP Summer Camp:** Designed for high school juniors and seniors, these camps introduce students to JAMP-participating colleges, admissions processes, and interview preparation. Students also gain valuable hands-on experience through research opportunities and clinical exposure with local physicians.
- **Early College High School Partnerships:** JAMP has expanded its outreach by partnering with Early College High School and Dual Credit Programs. These efforts aim to increase program awareness and provide opportunities for students with aspirations of attending medical school.
- **Pre-JAMP Symposia:** JAMP engages high school and college freshmen students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, introducing them to careers in medicine and opportunities in the medical field. Additionally, JAMP provides insights the application process, and steps toward medical school acceptance.

Student Professional Development Workshops

These workshops equip students with essential skills for college success and enhance their competitiveness as medical school applicants.

- **Seminars and Training:** JAMP partner institutions provide workshops covering medical terminology, CPR and First Aid certification, professional attire guidance, leadership development, and professional etiquette.

How It Works:

Overview of JAMP Scholar Holistic Curriculum

The JAMP model takes a holistic, data-driven approach, rooted in a continuous and comprehensive analysis of the student population it serves. By incorporating feedback from participating medical schools and evaluating both real-time and historical performance metrics, JAMP ensures its strategies remain aligned with student needs. Regular student surveys provide valuable insights into their experiences, fostering a responsive and adaptive program. Additionally, JAMP conducts ongoing formal and informal evaluations to guide strategic initiatives, ensuring the program remains effective, relevant, and impactful.

Immersive Internship

Foundations of Medical Education: JAMP's Summer Internship I

The Summer I Internship provides a foundation for understanding the rigors of medical school and how students can best prepare to overcome potential obstacles in achieving their goal of becoming a doctor. During the first summer program, students learn gross anatomy and physiology from medical school faculty, shadow doctors throughout the community, receive mock medical school admission interviews, and take cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and clinical enrichment skills training courses. In addition, students engage with current medical school students, attend various medical specialty lectures focused on managing stress, working as a critical care physician, medical ethics, and attend enrichment activities to promote a healthy work-school-life balance. Students also give back to Texas communities through service projects and activities during the weekends.

Advancing Medical Aspirations: JAMP's Summer Internship II

The Summer II Internship consists of lectures in embryology, biochemistry, ethics, professional helping skills, additional CPR training, clinical rotations, and medical preceptorships. Students also continue to participate in service projects, enrichment activities, and focused discussions on how they can best prepare for success as a doctor. Students that were required to retake the MCAT attended a mandatory MCAT tutoring program to achieve the required score. The MCAT tutoring program requires the students to take a practice MCAT each week followed with a review of the exam focused on addressing subject matter deficiencies. Students meeting the required minimum MCAT score could participate in a preceptorship in one of the following clinics: neurology, pediatrics, plastic surgery, anesthesiology, internal medicine, psychiatry, physical medicine and rehabilitation, cardiology, emergency medicine, surgery, and family medicine.

Mentorship

JAMP's Mentorship Initiatives

Among the included activities provided by each of the medical schools are mentorship initiatives designed to further support JAMP scholars and the undergraduate faculty directors. Medical school coordinators support JAMP scholars prior, during, and after each summer internship opportunity. At each summer internship, scholars are mentored to further their professional competencies and to ensure their readiness for medical school. Each of the medical school coordinators maintains contact with JAMP alternates by email and follow-up telephone calls.

Academic Enrichment

Enhancing Scientific Proficiency: JAMP's Core Enrichment Initiatives

Enrichment courses were provided to students to assess and enhance mastery of Critical Analysis and Reasoning Skills (CARS) to support MCAT preparation. In addition to the CARS preparation, additional enrichment courses were provided to increase the general content mastery in two foundation sciences (Biology and Chemistry) needed prior to students' MCAT preparation.

Personalized Academic Support: JAMP's Testing and Tutoring Services

Scholars who qualified for an additional attempt to meet the minimum MCAT score attended a customized Summer II Internship with a structured path to help them prepare for the retake. From the beginning of the summer program and until after the summer program ends, participants took one full-length practice exam each week and attended weekly online tutoring sessions to review their progress. Upon completion of the Test and Tutoring Program, this student group retook the MCAT. If students successfully raised their scores to the minimum requirement, they were then able to interview at a participating JAMP medical school.

Academic and Professional Writing Development Support

This initiative will ensure that scholars have the writing skills necessary to excel in medical school coursework and beyond. This initiative will provide targeted training to help scholars develop structured, evidence-based academic papers and enhance their ability to articulate complex ideas clearly and persuasively in a scholarly format.

JAMP will implement a professional writing initiative focused on crafting high-quality secondary applications to enhance scholars' competitiveness during the medical school admissions process. By strengthening their secondary applications, this initiative ensures scholars stand out as strong, competitive candidates.

MCAT Preparation

Strategic Alliance for MCAT Excellence: JAMP and Jack Westin's Joint Effort

Recognizing the critical role of the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) in medical school admissions, JAMP has collaborated with Jack Westin to provide tailored MCAT preparation services. This partnership features a strategic three-tier system that classifies scholars based on performance, allowing for personalized interventions:

- **Tier 1:** Scholars demonstrating strong MCAT readiness receive standard preparation resources to maintain their trajectory.
- **Tier 2:** Scholars requiring moderate support receive additional resources and guidance to address specific areas of improvement.
- **Tier 3:** Scholars needing significant intervention receive intensive, customized support to elevate their performance to the desired standard.

This tiered approach ensures that each scholar receives the appropriate level of support, optimizing their potential for success on the MCAT.

Health and Wellness

Health and Well-Being Support: JAMP's Initiative with OnlineMedEd

The JAMP Scholar Success Seminar Series focuses on mental health, resilience, and effective study strategies, promoting overall well-being and academic success. The seminar series empowered JAMP Scholars with practical strategies for academic success, stress management, and personal growth. By fostering resilience, focus, and self-care, these sessions reflect JAMP's commitment to holistically serving the whole scholar, equipping them with tools to thrive on their journey to medical school.

Financial Literacy

Empowering Financial Acumen: JAMP's Collaboration with Business of Financial Wellness

Recognizing the critical role of financial literacy in the success of medical professionals, JAMP is collaborating with the Business of Financial Wellness to provide scholars with comprehensive financial education. This initiative aims to equip JAMP scholars with essential skills in debt management, investment strategies, and financial planning, addressing a significant gap in traditional medical education. By fostering financial literacy, we empower our scholars to make informed financial decisions throughout their medical careers, enhancing their overall well-being and professional success.

Scholarly Research

Investigating Health Disparities in Texas: JAMP's Commitment to Equitable Medical Education

Scholarly research is an important piece of the JAMP Scholar curriculum because it equips students with critical thinking skills, fosters a deeper understanding of health needs, and prepares them to contribute meaningfully to evidence-based medical practices as future physicians. Scholars will engage in guided research projects focusing on the community health needs in Texas. This initiative strengthens scholars' academic and analytical skills. It connects them to the healthcare needs of their communities, fostering a sense of purpose and commitment to making a difference in Texas.

Through this initiative, scholars will:

- Gain critical research skills, including data analysis, literature reviews, and presentation techniques.
- Analyze disparities in healthcare access and outcomes across diverse communities in Texas.
- Participate in the final stages of the research process by engaging in peer reviews, presenting their findings to peers and faculty, and being encouraged to share their research at local and national conferences.
- Explore Texas-specific healthcare challenges to ignite their interest in becoming physicians in Texas, thereby contributing to efforts to reduce the state's healthcare disparities.

Medical School Transition Support

Enhancing Pre-Matriculation Success: JAMP's Partnership with OnlineMedEd

JAMP has partnered with OnlineMedEd to offer a comprehensive pre-matriculation curriculum to facilitate a smooth transition into medical school. This program is designed to give scholars a preview of the first year of medical school.

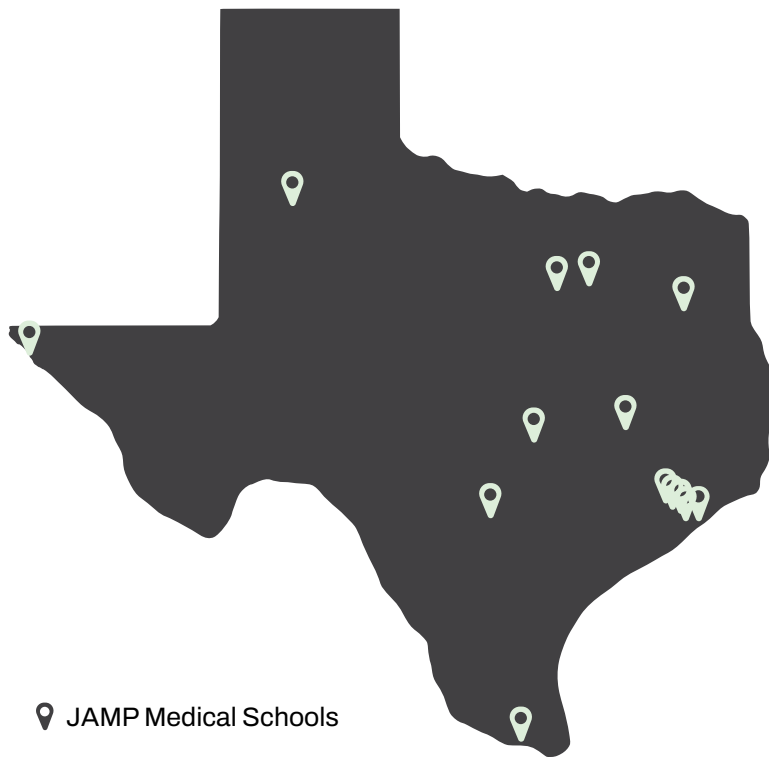

Outcomes and Impact: Scholar Academic Performance

The Joint Admission Medical Program (JAMP) continues to demonstrate its impact on fostering academic achievement and advancing medical school readiness for underrepresented and economically disadvantaged students in Texas. By providing critical resources, mentorship, and support, JAMP has consistently prepared scholars to meet the rigorous demands of medical school. Over the past two years, the program has shown promising trends, particularly in areas that underscore its effectiveness in supporting its mission.

In 2023, JAMP scholars achieved strong academic performance with overall and science GPAs of 3.87 and 3.83, respectively. While reflecting the challenges of competitive pre-medical coursework, these results indicate the program's ability to guide students through academically demanding pathways. The 2023 cohort's results align closely with historical trends, highlighting consistency and resilience among scholars.

Furthermore, scholars in 2023 achieved average MCAT scores of 508, representing steady performance and signaling the program's success in equipping students for medical school entrance exams. These scores underscore the value of JAMP's enhanced test preparation resources and personalized guidance, ensuring students are well-prepared to compete at the highest levels.

The JAMP data on GPAs and MCAT scores highlight the program's significant role in fostering academic excellence and medical school readiness among economically disadvantaged students. The consistently high GPAs and strong MCAT scores reflect the effectiveness of JAMP's resources, mentorship, and test preparation in helping scholars overcome barriers and meet the competitive standards of medical school admissions. These outcomes not only demonstrate the program's ability to support scholars through rigorous pre-medical pathways but also underscore its critical impact in building a well-prepared pipeline of future Texas physicians.

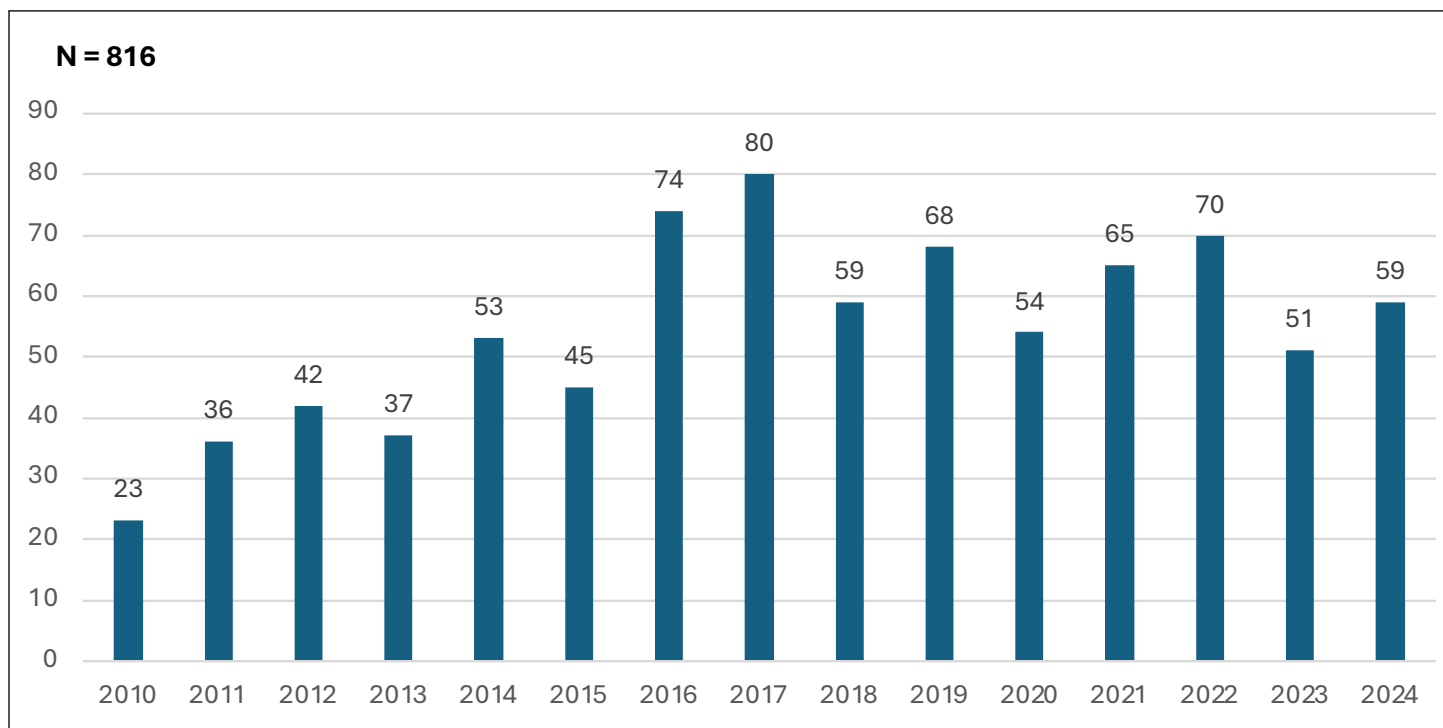

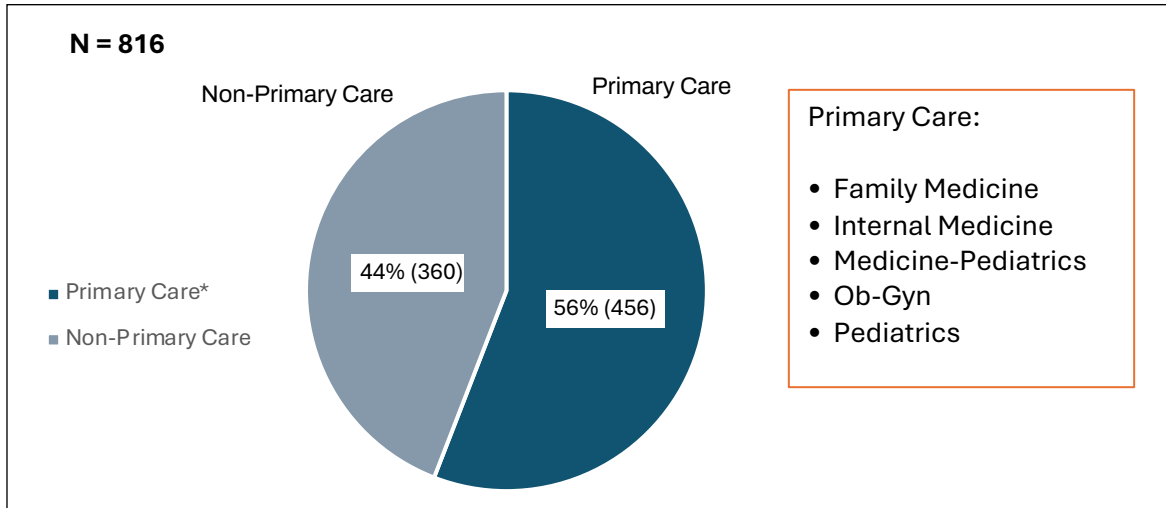

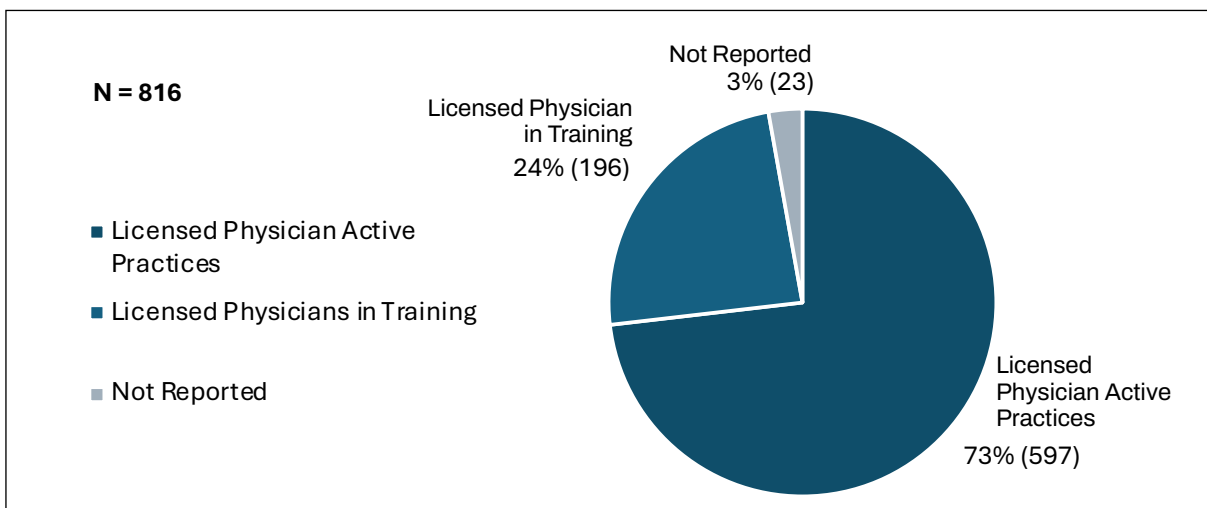
JAMP Scholar Graduates Entering Primary Care and Non-Primary Care Residency Programs 2010-2024

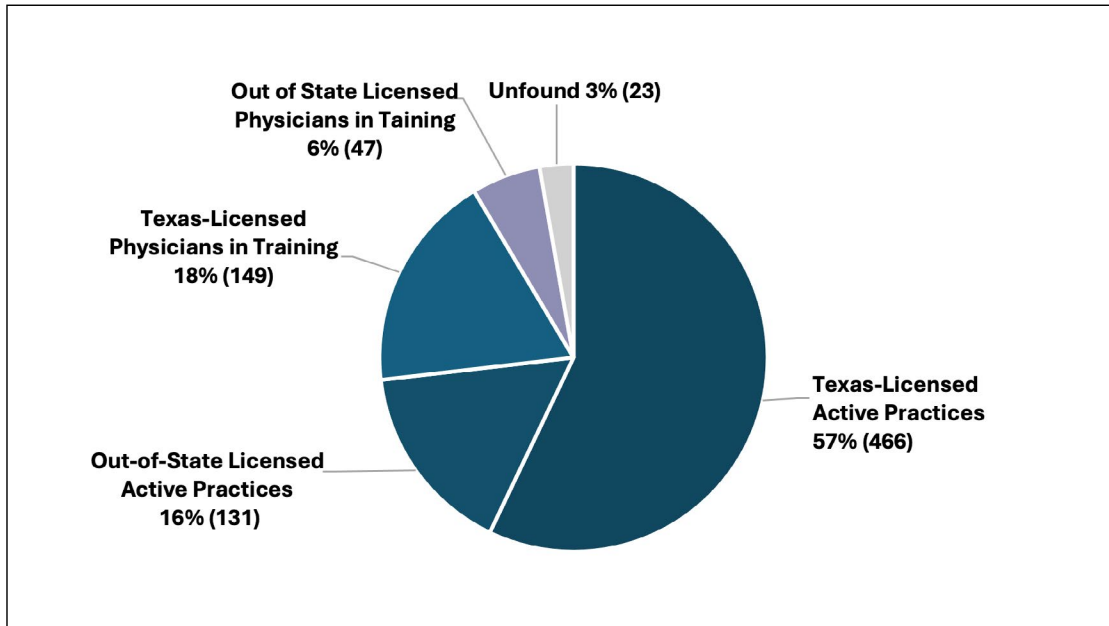
JAMP Scholar Licensed-Physician Active Practices and Licensed Physicians in Training 2010-2024

Report on Expenditures

Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) Program Distribution

Funds are allocated to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board for the Joint Admission Medical Program (JAMP) and transferred to the JAMP Council pursuant to agreements executed between the JAMP Council, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, and The University of Texas System.

Undergraduate Student Summer Stipends

Eligible JAMP participants received stipends of \$1,500 per student in FY2022, totaling \$270,000, and \$1,500 per student in FY2023, totaling \$300,000. These funds supported students attending summer internships at participating Texas medical schools, offsetting potential lost income from summer employment.

Undergraduate Student Scholarships

Each public program participant received a \$1,000 scholarship per semester to reduce the cost of undergraduate tuition and fees. In FY2022, scholarships totaled \$304,000. In FY2023, scholarships increased to \$358,000, reflecting additional undergraduate participants. Notably, \$226,000 supported Spring 2023 awards, and \$132,000 supported Fall 2023 scholarships.

Medical School Student Scholarships

Medical students in the program received \$4,000 scholarships per year. In FY2022, JAMP allocated \$1,204,000, which increased to \$1,300,000 in FY2023, covering 325 students for the 2023-2024 academic year.

Undergraduate Schools Program Costs

Public undergraduate institutions received base funding of \$12,000 each, with additional funds allocated based on program participation. In FY2022, the program distributed \$523,199, which increased to \$525,000 in FY2023. These funds supported academic counseling, tutoring, and mentoring, as well as activities managed by JAMP Faculty Directors.

Medical Schools Program Costs

Thirteen participating medical schools each received \$60,000 annually for program administration, totaling \$780,000 in FY2022 and FY2023. Funds were used to recruit eligible undergraduate students, provide faculty and administrative support, and mentor JAMP participants.

Medical Schools Summer Internship Program Costs

In FY2022, JAMP funded \$1,101,425 for summer internship programs, transitioning back to in-person experiences. In FY2023, this increased to \$1,292,500 to support expanded program costs, including faculty stipends, facility expenses, and administrative salaries.

Medical School Interview Stipends

To comply with Section 51.824(6)(C) of the Texas Education Code, JAMP awarded stipends to students to cover medical school interview travel costs. In FY2022, undergraduate JAMP Scholars interviewing for medical school received a \$3,000 stipend, totaling \$141,000. For FY2023, undergraduate JAMP Scholars interviewing for medical school received a \$3,000 stipend, with a significant increase in total amount to \$300,000, supporting 75% of the entering class and summer MCAT retesters.

Report on Expenditures

MCAT Preparation

JAMP allocated \$259,750 in FY2022 for MCAT preparation. In FY2023, funding increased to \$314,650, covering resources like Kaplan and UWorld to ensure students' readiness for the exam.

Evaluation and Development Costs

To support the program's continued growth, JAMP allocated \$50,000 in FY2022 and increased funding to \$60,000 in FY2023 for program evaluation and strategic improvements.

Pre-JAMP Outreach Program Costs

The JAMP Council allocated \$200,000 in FY2022 and FY2023 to support regional outreach initiatives, recruitment efforts, and pre-med academic enrichment camps targeting economically disadvantaged students.

Administrative Costs

Administrative expenses totaled \$474,490 in FY2022 and increased to \$551,160 in FY2023, covering office operations, maintenance, and staff salaries.

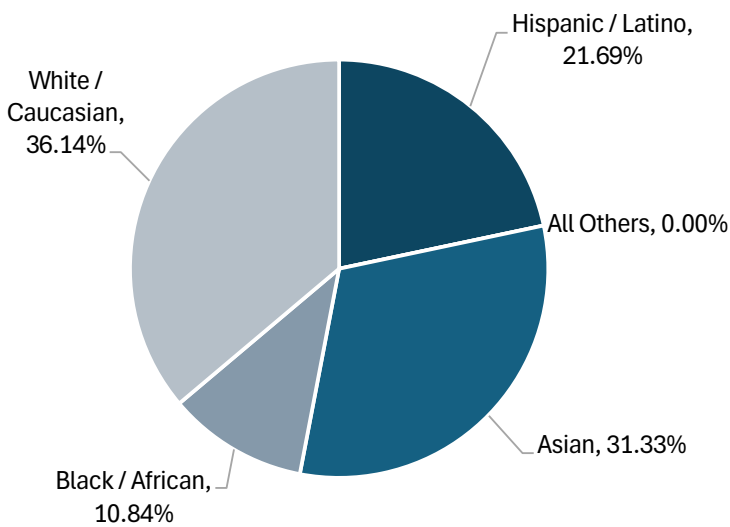

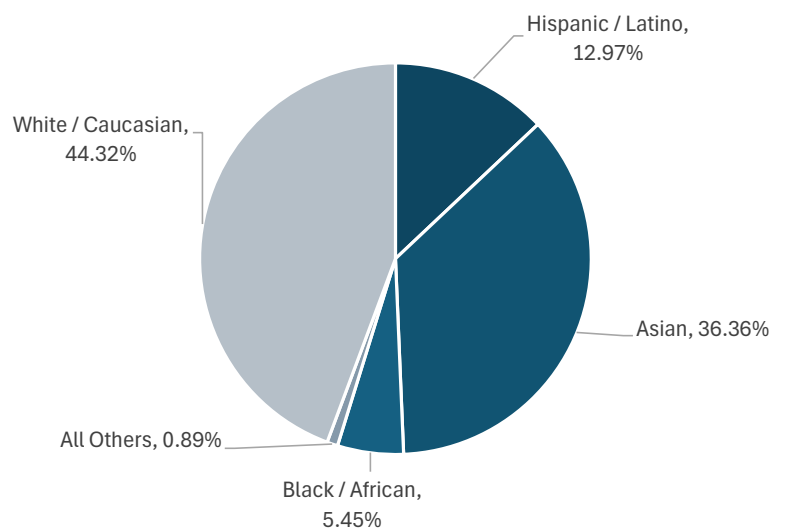
